From the CEO: Grow Bold with Us

Eventide Lutheran Home, a nonprofit organization, has been a part of the fabric of this community for over 55 years and we are gearing up to show senior care organizations the way forward. We are engaging in our next and perhaps greatest challenge ever: to transform the way long term care services are delivered and to change the concept of a 'nursing home' forever. In response to the ever changing needs of seniors and their expectations as they age, we want to ensure the Eventide Campus has the best environments to take care of the people we serve. Over the years, Eventide has tried to keep up by remodeling, adding living spaces and changing shared rooms into private rooms to help us maintain our high standards for quality care. Architects and engineers have determined that it is no longer cost effective to continue remodeling efforts, and therefore we believe the time is now for a substantial financial investment in facilities that will transform our community's health care future.

Now during our boldest move yet, our vision is to build in Phase 1, a \$15 million replacement Skilled Nursing Facility and incorporate the household model of resident-directed care. Phase 2 will be to add to our continuum by building a \$3 million Memory Support Assisted Living. As we currently work on Phase 1 of our vision, Eventide Senior Living Community officially kicked off a \$3 Million Dollar Grow Bold With Us Capital Campaign in April 2019. Phase 1 will be located adjacent to our campus on the former hospital site. Phase 2 will adjoin the current assisted living, Silveridge.

We are proud to report that the Eventide Foundation has pledged \$1 million to our Grow Bold with Us Campaign. The Eventide Foundation was created in 1991 to collect funds to supplement the increasing costs of personal care and to provide amenities to residents that would otherwise not be available. Over the years, donations have been invested making this pledge to Phase 1 a reality.

In addition, Mr. Nix Lauridsen has graciously given a legacy gift of \$1 million towards the replacement of the nursing facility. Mr. Nix Lauridsen's gift is in honor of his parents, Frances and Wally Lauridsen, of which the building will be named after. On behalf of the entire Eventide Community and those we serve, I cannot thank Mr. Nix Lauridsen enough for his legacy gift and believing in our project. I have so much admiration for not only his business sense, but his philanthropic ways and truly mak-

ing a difference in nonprofits throughout the State of Iowa. The Lauridsen Family story is certainly an impressive one.

We have spent time visiting with individuals and businesses about our project to measure support and need in this community. With the Eventide Foundation and Mr. Nix Lauridsen's support to date, we must raise an additional \$1 million before we can break ground on Phase 1 to build the replacement of the nursing facility. We hope to have this money raised in 2019 so we can break ground in early 2020.

In general, the new nursing facility will consist of 4 households. Each of these households will host living spaces we would find in our own residential homes. From the kitchen, living room, dining area, private bedrooms and bathrooms, to

laundry room and private courtyards. The household will create a much more residential environment, leaving the institutional feel a thing of the past. The households will be connected to what we are calling Main Street. Main Street will host spaces we would normally go 'to town' for. This is where we can attend church, exercise at the gym, see our beautician, and even attend the live musical entertainment. The entire building will have more areas for visitor interaction such as the front porch, game room, or the sun room, just to name a few examples.

APIC Certificate of Infection Prevention – Tracee Gettys

The Association for Professionals in Infection Control and Epidemiology (APIC) hosted a series of classes for those in long-term care. Eventide Nurse Manager, Tracee Gettys, RN, has completed the course and now brings this certification to Eventide and its residents! The course provided the fundamentals of infection surveillance, prevention and control, and tailored them to the long-term care setting. The overall goal for the series was to provide attendees with a baseline knowledge to begin working in infection control.

This certification puts Eventide ahead of the curve with upcoming requirements to have an Infection Prevention Specialist on staff. Her knowledge will guide our team through infection control programs and best practices. "Tracee now has the education to lead Eventide through the new federal guidelines for Infection Preventionist program, said Amy Schultz, Eventide Administrator, "By performing a risk assessment, we will be able to review our current infection control program for residents and staff, make goals to improve upon our current plan, and be in compliance with regulations."

Keep Your Skin in Mind this Spring!

With the warmer weather finally on the horizon, a very important topic comes to my mind... our skin! Being the largest organ of our body, our skin's primary role is PROTECTION. It protects our bodies from external impacts and pressure, temperature variations, pathogen and micro-organism entry, exposure to radiation and chemicals, as well as many other things.

Unfortunately, our skin is something that is easily taken for granted and overlooked. We often over-expose it to harmful elements, some of which can cause permanent and even life-threatening conditions. It is so important to know how to prevent damage as well as know what to look for as a potential concern.

May is Melanoma awareness month! Melanoma is the most dangerous form of skin cancer. Some people ask, "Well how does one get skin cancer?" Well... the sun's rays can cause the actual DNA of our skin cells to change or become damaged. This results in a defect that can cause the cells to start rapidly

multiplying which can lead to tumors. Some don't realize it but the tumors can actually start out looking like a harmless little mole when in fact it's a malignant tumor! This is why routine skin checks by your primary care provider are so important. They are trained to know exactly what to look for and some even have a device that can look at the cells on a more microscopic level to detect if they're harmful.

If skin cancers such as Melanoma are caught early enough and treated early, they're most always curable. The problem, however, is many people don't have the area check or identified until the cancer is more advanced. Once the cancerous cells extend beyond the subcutaneous tissues, they can enter the blood stream and lymphatic system which grants them access to the rest of the body. The cancer can quickly grow from a curable condition to a terminal one.

We are never too old to start taking care of our skin! So, when as the weather warms up in the next few months, be sure to keep your skin in mind!

- Avoid sunburns
- Avoid tanning, do not use UV tanning beds
- Cover up with clothing, including a hat and sunglasses
- Use sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher every day, using a water-resistant sunscreen of SPF 30 or higher during outdoor activities
- Examine your skin head-to-toe every month
- See your PCP or a dermatologist at least once a year for a professional skin exam
- Report any abnormal area to your doctor immediately

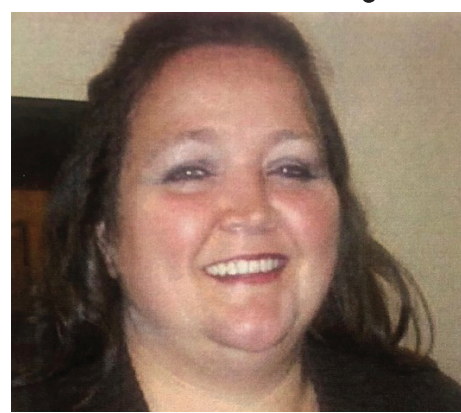

Information and contact information for filing grievances or complaints concerning any suspected violation of state or federal nursing facility regulations, including but not limited to resident abuse, neglect, exploitation, misappropriation of resident property in the facility, non-compliance with the advance directives requirements and requests for information regarding returning to the community.
