## Resident Rights

**Information and communication (cont.):** The resident has the right to be informed of his or her rights and of all rules and regulations governing resident conduct and responsibilities during his or her stay in the facility.

- K. The resident has the right to –
- Examine the results of the most recent survey of the facility conducted by Federal or State surveyors and any plan of correction in effect with respect to the facility; and
  - Receive information from agencies acting as client advocates, and be afforded the opportunity to contact these agencies.
- The facility must –
    - Post in a place readily accessible to residents, and family members and legal representatives of residents, the results of the most recent survey of the facility.
    - Have reports with respect to any surveys, certifications, and complaint investigations made respecting the facility during the 3 preceding years, and any plan of correction in effect with the respect to the facility, available for any individual to review upon request; and
    - Post notice of the availability of such reports in areas of the facility that are prominent and accessible to the public
    - The facility shall not make available identifying information about complainants or residents
