Iowa Department of Public Health and Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals have released guidance for Phased Easing of Restrictions for long term care facilities. The guidance utilizes a three phased approach, consistent with federal guidance, to strike a balance between the need to maintain mitigation efforts that minimize exposure to COVID-19 and the need to maintain the quality of life and dignity necessary for the psychosocial well-being of residents. Silveridge Assisted Living will have a modified approach to these phases.

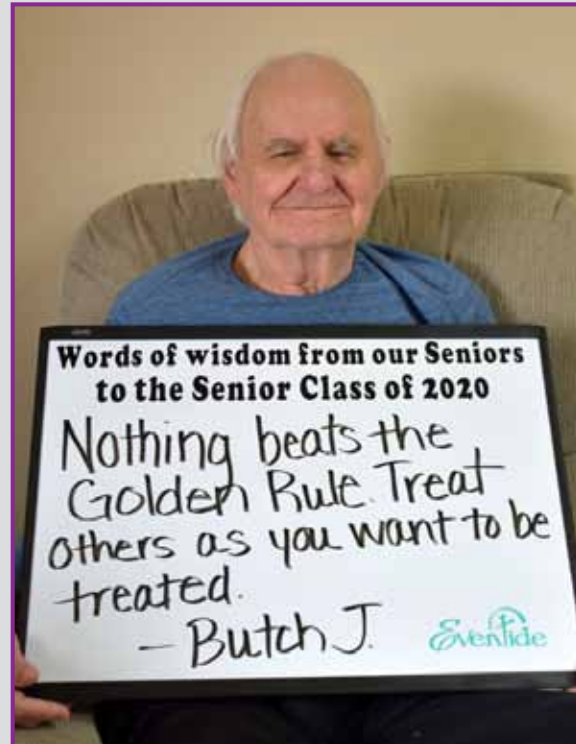

Running Essential Errands

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Stay home if sick.
- Use online services when available.
- Wear a cloth face covering when running errands.
- Use social distancing (stay at least 6 feet away from others).
- Use hand sanitizer after leaving stores.
- Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds when you get home.

GROCERY SHOPPING

Stay home if sick

- Avoid shopping if you are sick or have symptoms of COVID-19, which include a fever, cough, or shortness of breath.

ORDER ONLINE OR USE CURBSIDE PICKUP

- Order food and other items online for home delivery or curbside pickup (if possible).
- Only visit the grocery store, or other stores selling household essentials, in person when you absolutely need to. This will limit your potential exposure to others and the virus that causes COVID-19.

PROTECT YOURSELF WHILE SHOPPING

- Stay at least 6 feet away from others while shopping and in lines.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face covering when you have to go out in public.
- When you do have to visit in person, go during hours when fewer people will be there (for example, early morning or late night).
- If you are at higher risk for severe illness, find out if the store has special hours for people at higher risk. If they do, try to shop during those hours. People at higher risk for severe illness include adults 65 or older and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions.
- Disinfect the shopping cart, use disinfecting wipes if available.
- Do not touch your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- If possible, use touchless payment (pay without touching money, a card, or a keypad). If you must handle money, a card, or use a keypad, use hand sanitizer right after paying.

USE HAND SANITIZER

- After leaving the store, use hand sanitizer. Wash hands at home
- When you get home, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Follow food safety guidelines: clean, separate, cook, chill. There is no evidence that food or food packaging play a significant role in spreading the virus in the United States.

DELIVERIES & TAKEOUT

Limit in person contact if possible

- Pay online or on the phone when you order (if possible).
- Accept deliveries without in-person contact whenever possible. Ask for deliveries to be left in a safe spot outside your house (such as your front porch or lobby), with no person-to-person interaction. Otherwise, stay at least 6 feet away from the delivery person.

Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer after accepting deliveries or collecting mail

- After receiving your delivery or bringing home your takeout food, wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- After collecting mail from a post office or home mailbox, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

BANKING

Bank online whenever possible

- Ask about options for telephone or virtual meetings to use banking services.
- Use drive-thru banking services, automated teller machines (ATM), or mobile banking apps for routine transactions that do not require face-to-face assistance as much as possible.
- Look for any extra prevention practices being implemented by the bank, such as plexiglass barriers for tellers or bankers, staff wearing cloth face coverings, or physical distancing signs in the lobby.
- Wear a cloth face covering when doing any in-person exchanges and unable to stay at least 6 feet apart from other people – and make sure that bank employees and other people inside the bank are also wearing cloth face coverings.
- Try not to use pens or other items from a public counter if possible.
- Use hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol after any deposit, withdrawal, exchange, drive-thru visit, or use of an ATM.
- Wash your hands thoroughly when you arrive home or to your destination where a restroom is available.

GETTING GAS

- Use disinfecting wipes on handles and buttons before you touch them (if available).
- After fueling, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds when you get home or somewhere with soap and water.

- 1 pkg, 8oz Philadelphia Cream Cheese, softened
- ¼ cup Lemonade Mix
- 2 Tbsp Sugar
- ½ cup Milk

- 1 Graham Cracker Crumb Crust, Ready to Use

Directions:

Beat cream cheese, drink mix and sugar in a large bowl with a mixer until well blended. Gradually beat in milk. Whisk in whipped topping. Spoon into crust and refrigerate 1 hour.

Eventide Awarded Crawford County Community Foundation Grant

team of employees, who have been assigned care to each new admission, readmission, or symptomatic/positive case.

Resident Rights Exercise of Rights:

The resident has the right to exercise his or her rights as a resident of the facility and as a citizen or resident of the United States.

- The resident has the right to be free of interference, coercion, discrimination, and reprisal from the facility in exercising his or her rights and to be supported by the facility in the exercise of his or her rights
- In the case of a resident who has not been adjudged incompetent by the State court, the resident has the right to designate a representative, in accordance with State law and any legal surrogate so designated may exercise the resident's rights to the extent provided by the State law.
- The same-sex spouse of a resident must be afforded treatment equal to that afforded to an opposite-sex spouse if the marriage was valid in the jurisdiction in which it was celebrated.
- The resident representative has the right to exercise the resident's rights to the extent those rights are delegated to the resident representative.
