We have a wide range of people experiencing the Dementia continuum who attend. At times we have those who are noticing memory changes for themselves and asking questions how to slow progression of memory loss. We have several who are currently caregivers at home currently to their loved one experiencing side effects of memory loss, as well as family to residents who are currently living in an Eventide community. You might just be someone curious about the disease. Everyone is welcome.

As this group continues, we are constantly looking at ways to improve so we are meeting the needs of our community. As part of this effort, we are planning to invite a variety of guest speakers to cover topics that matter most to our attendees. Some of these topics may include:

- how to have meaningful visits with your loved one
- the role of hospice in caregiving
- how different types of dementia impact care

Starting in August, we are also excited to offer respite care during our meetings. We understand how difficult it can be to step away when you are a full-time caregiver. To support you, you are welcome to bring your loved one with you. Our trained staff will be available to care for them while you attend the support group meeting. 

## EVENTIDE FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT FUND

When you donate to a permanently endowed fund at a qualified community foundation, you are not only helping your neighbors today — you are building a stronger community tomorrow. And while that in itself is rewarding, with the Endow Iowa Tax Credit Program, you will also get back for giving. You will be eligible to receive a 25% tax credit for each donation, in addition to any federal tax benefits you may qualify for. Eligible gifts will qualify for credits on a first-come, first-served basis until the yearly appropriated limit is reached.
