Silveridge Assisted Living Celebrates 15 Years of Exceptional Care

On January 10th, 2011 Silveridge Assisted Living opened its doors and eagerly welcomed its first occupants. As an original staff member, I can still picture myself walking through the doors on that day to clock in for my first shift as a Silveridge nurse, the scent of fresh carpeting and new upholstery lingering in the air. I also fondly recall attending one of the very first open house celebrations in the weeks leading to opening day, standing in awe of the spacious, beautiful apartments and the warm, inviting ambiance, while a saxophone player filled the main common area with holiday tunes.

I remember feeling nervous in those first few days as a staff member, unsure of what to expect in a brand-new assisted living. With only five original tenants to care for, much of my early time was spent cleaning, organizing, and stocking supplies – the quiet, behind-the-scenes work that slowly brings a building to life. Yet the dream of Silveridge had been taking shape long before opening day. As early as 1999, the Eventide Board of Directors made their first installment to purchase the old 20th Street football field, the very ground where Silveridge now stands. In 2006, the board and now CEO Mindi Baker began shaping that vision in earnest, guided by a market study that revealed an unmet need for assisted living in the area. With a total project cost of \$5.8 million, a year of careful planning, groundbreaking on April 12, 2010, and another nine months of construction for the 40,000-square-foot facility, Silveridge Assisted Living finally became a reality - one built not just of brick and mortar, but of compassion, purpose, and community.

In the early days, Silveridge was carried forward by a small but devoted team of just eight staff members, not including the maintenance and business office support shared with the neighboring Eventide facilities. Together, those

eight provided everything our tenants needed -care, meals, meaningful activities- day and night. As the years passed, Silveridge grew, not only in the number of tenants we welcomed but also in the depth and complexity of care we were honored to provide. In response, our staffing gradually expanded, nearly tripling to the strong, capable team we have today. Perhaps most meaningful of all, we are proud to say that nearly half of those original eight team members remain with us today - a living testament to the loyalty, dedication, and love for our tenants that have always defined Silveridge.

Since opening our doors 15 years ago, Silveridge has proudly maintained deficiency-free inspections from the Iowa Department of Inspections, Appeals and Licensing. While achieving a deficiency-free survey from time to time is an accomplishment other programs may experience, it is exceptionally rare to find an assisted living program in Iowa that has sustained this level of performance for 15 consecutive years. This achievement reflects more than regulatory success, it represents a long-standing commitment to care, integrity, and doing what is right for those who call Silveridge home. In 2023 we began a phased remodeling project which initially focused on updating flooring and paint with plans to continue updates on lighting and finishes in the near future. Although we take pride in these accomplishments, they also humble us. We continue to hold ourselves to a higher standard and remain committed to learning, growing, and finding new ways to serve even better tomorrow than we do today.

Silveridge plans to celebrate the past 15 years, as well as our past and present tenants and staff on Thursday January 15th, 2026 with an open house from 3-5pm. We hope you take time out of your day to come be a part of this special celebration!

Small Acts, Big Impact: Helping Our Elderly Neighbors

As Midwesterners, we are fortunate to enjoy a strong sense of community and neighbors willing to help. When we are young and agile, we often take for granted all that we can do for ourselves without a second thought. However, as we get older, we may need to rely on others for help and support. Especially during the winter months, our elderly neighbors may need assistance but might be reluctant to ask. There are always small acts of kindness we can offer that can significantly improve the lives of our older neighbors.

One of the biggest challenges we see when elderly live alone, is loneliness. Sometimes, a simple phone call to check in can mean the world. You may be the only person they talk to all day. Conversations like these can also help you notice warning signs, such as changes in health or potential scams. Older adults are particularly vulnerable to scams, and having someone looking out for them can prevent serious consequences. Similarly, not being able to reach a neighbor could signal that something is wrong, making your check-ins potentially life-saving.

As mobility and transportation become more challenging, seniors may struggle with everyday tasks. Simple acts of assistance, like picking up groceries, shoveling snow, offering rides to appointments or events, can make a big difference. Seniors who live alone often rely on convenient meals, so bringing a home-cooked dish can brighten their day and provide meals for several days.

Helping an elderly neighbor does not have to be complicated. Your presence, care, and attention can make them feel truly seen and valued.

Committed to Nutrition and Excellence

Help us to congratulate Jamie Heffernan on successfully completing and passing her Certified Dietary Manager (CDM) course and national certification exam. After nearly a year of online classes, while continuing to work full-time, Jamie dedicated herself to exam preparation and achieved this important professional milestone! Not only was she supported by her team, but the Eventide Foundation as well. Jamie applied for and received Tuition Assistance funds from the Foundation, which helped cover the costs associated with her coursework and certification, and alleviated the financial burden of career advancement.

In nursing homes, federal regulations under CMS §483.60 require that if a qualified dietitian is not employed full-time, the facility must designate a Director of Food and Nutrition Services. As of 2025, becoming a Certified Dietary Manager is a primary qualification for this role. At Gracewell, our part-time dietitian Jenna Schaben, Jamie, and the nursing team work closely together to ensure residents' nutritional needs are met.

A Certified Dietary Manager is a food service professional who has completed specialized education and passed a national certification exam. CDMs are trained in nutrition, food safety, sanitation, and management, and they collaborate with dietitians, nurses, and healthcare staff to support residents' overall health through high-quality meal service.

In a nursing home setting, CDMs oversee daily food service operations, including menu planning that meets state and federal regulations and accommodates special dietary needs such as diabetic, low-sodium, or texture-modified diets. They also supervise kitchen staff, ensuring proper food handling, sanitation, and safety practices are followed to maintain a clean and compliant kitchen environment.

Nutrition plays a vital role in healing, energy, and overall well-being. By working closely with residents, families, dietitians, and care teams, a Certified Dietary Manager helps ensure meals are both nutritious and enjoyable, positively impacting resident health and quality of life.

From the CEO:

Eventide Senior Living Campus is proud to serve our community through four distinct buildings—each designed to meet a unique level of care or housing need. Gracewell is our licensed skilled nursing facility; Silveridge provides licensed assisted living; and both Heritage Heights and Realife Cooperative offer maintenance-free housing options.

As care needs change over time, residents may request a transition to a different level of service or a new housing option within our campus. Residents already living on the Eventide Campus are always given the highest priority for these transitions. However, due to the strong demand for our services, there may be instances when a wait list is necessary for a particular building or level of care. Please keep this in mind if you anticipate the need for a future transition. Early communication helps us plan and coordinate the smoothest possible experience. Our team remains committed to doing everything we can to accommodate the needs of those who call Eventide home.

Also worth noting, Eventide does not offer life care contracts which guarantee lifetime housing and care as needs change. While we offer a full continuum of services, we do not operate under this contractual model, which usually requires large up-front entrance fees.

We understand how important timely placement is, and we deeply appreciate your patience and trust as we work to meet the needs of all residents.
